

GRADING SYSTEM OF ESIEE PARIS

EVALUATION OF COURSE UNITS

For each course unit, a mark and a grade representing the level of skills acquired are determined.

Mark points are calculated over 20 points.

A minimum of 10 points is required to validate the course.

The grade, from A to E, in case of success, or FX to F, in case of fail, represents the ranking of the student among the group of students within the course unit.

GPA: Grade Point Average / CGPA: Cumulated Grade Point Average
